
(A) SRF Grant for Rehabilitation of Sewer System


~~Interim City Manager Bill Holloway requested approval of the Task Order to authorizing Preble-Rish to complete a the Sstudy of the Ccity's current Ssewer Ssystem. Wayne Graham asked if the job could be done with the \$65,000. Bill noted that the Preble-Rish would pursue funding to rehabilitate and repair the city's sewer and collection and transmission system, with grant funding being received from the Florida Department of Enviromental Protection's State Revolving Fund (FDEP-SRF) in the amount of \$65,346.00. was funded by the grant to complete the Study. Kermit Wright asked if we really need this testing done. Bill Holloway stated that we have an aging infrastructure and that this testing was critical in finding problems that need to be addressed and fixed. The project would also receive an additional \$110,000 grant funding for associated specialized studies such as videoing, smoke testing, dye testing, etc. The \$65,346 grant is 100 percent funded by the FDEP/SRF Grant so there is no cost to the city, however, the \$110,000 grant is a 50 percent match through the FDEP/SRF Grant. The total project cost being \$285,346.~~

Councilman Motion by Henry Ennis made a motion to approve the SRF Grant for Rehabilitation of Sewer System in the amount of \$65,346 at a 100 percent funding and \$110,000 at a 50 percent funding request with Mayor Carpenter executing the agreement, second by Kermit Councilman Wright. Motion carried 5-0.
